• An outline of the main activities/projects in last 12 months

The activities of iEARN Suriname in the past 12 months were focused on the implementation of several iEARN projects in schools of different levels (primary, secondary), Coordination of YES in Surinanme (for first time) and the execution of the Global Teenager Project together with partner schools and organizations in the Netherlands and Dutch Antilles.

Here is an overview of the activities:

- 1. In july 2008 the my Hero Project was carried out at the George Asin school (junior high school) The whole school worked on the project. Each class had to choose a hero and an exhibition was held of all presentations. This was the first iEARN project in the school. The motivation to carry out more iEARN projects is really high at the school.
- 2. The learning circles: 7 schools for special education (for slow learning children), 3 primary schools and 4 junior high schools got an ADSL internet connection and 6 months of free internet availability. With the help of the biggest telecommunication provider in the country Telesur this was made possibility. They also received donations: personal computers.
- 3. There is a twinning project between the Kangoeroe school (primary school) and a school in the Netherlands.
- 4. There was a Learning circle project carried out from February 23 till may 31, 2009 by several schools from Suriname, the Netherlands and Curacao. For the Suriname there were 8 Special Education schools, 5 primary schools and 4 junior highschools. Also involved in this big undertaking were 33 teachers, 3 coordinators (of the iEARN Suriname coordination team) and 200 children.
- 5. Mrs. Elizabeth Burgos of the iEARN Suriname Coordinationteam was also actively involved in the facilitation of "Creative Arts online course" and the "OAS Teacher Education for the 21st Century online course".
- 6. A big opportunity also came our way, as Suriname was selected by the AYUSA Consortium to take part in the Youth Exchange and Study program 2009/2010. Suriname is the first country in the western hemisphere to take part in this beautiful project. We started out very motivated and got 3 schools involved in this pilot. At least 15 schools were approached to take part in this endeavor, of which 3 reacted

positively. After the selection procedures out of 14 candidates the final 5 were chosen. These students are now being prepared to take part in the YES 2009/2010 program. Several activities and projects were carried out in order to give the students the opportunity to prepare themselves in any way possible for this exchange.
